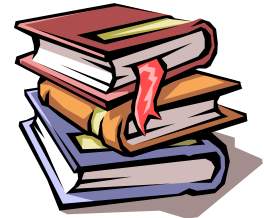


Passport

Suggested novels located on the back. You are not limited to five books. READ, READ, READ!

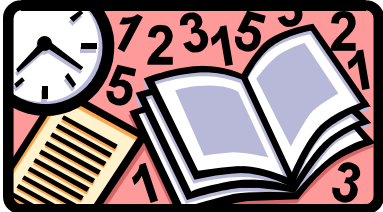
